2:05 PM - 3:10 PM	<p>COVID-19: Impact on State Repositories and Justice Agencies <i>Facilitator: Dennis DeBacco, SEARCH. Speakers: Chasity Anderson, FBI Compact Officer; Brad Cazort, Director, Arkansas Crime Information Center; Mindy McKay, Division Administrator and CSO, Records, Communications and Compliance Division, Nevada Department of Public Safety; Debbie McKinney, Division Director, Information Services Division, Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; Kathy Monfreda, Director, Division of Statewide Services, Alaska Department of Public Safety.</i></p> <p>Members will share the ongoing impact of the pandemic on the operations of the CCH repositories and justice agencies in their state, including challenges, solutions, and lessons learned. The discussion will focus on 1) expanding demand for criminal history records, particularly NICS, 2) disruptions to existing fingerprint submission processes, 3) temporary suspension of fingerprinting requirements for employment and licensing, and the impact this will have moving forward, and 4) changes in business practice, remote working arrangements, staff scheduling, potentially massive budget reductions, etc.</p>
3:10 PM - 4:20 PM	<p>NIBRS Implementation and Analysis <i>Ms. Drema Fouch, NIBRS Coordinator, FBI</i></p> <p>Ms. Fouch will provide an update on the current status of state and agency NIBRS participation, as well as an update on federal and tribal agency participation efforts.</p> <p><i>Ms. Erica Smith, BJS Unit Chief: Estimating Reported Crime Using Incident-based Data</i></p> <p>Ms. Smith will present on the National Crime Statistics Exchange (NCS-X), a joint program between the Bureau of Justice Statistics and the FBI to generate national estimates of crime based on data recorded in the FBI's National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). She will discuss the status of transition efforts among NCS-X participants, and NIBRS more broadly, and the technical assistance provided by BJS and other partner</p>



organizations to support law enforcement agencies as they work to report data to NIBRS. She will also discuss the NCS-X NIBRS Estimation Project, which will establish the statistical methodology and computational protocols to generate national estimates of crime based on NIBRS data. She will provide updates on the project's key indicators of focus, the timeline for generating preliminary estimates, and upcoming tasks in 2021.

Dr. Kimberly Martin, BJS Statistician: Analytic Models and Visualization Techniques Using NIBRS Data

Dr. Martin will present on the Bureau of Justice Statistics analytics program developed to showcase data from the FBI's National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). She will discuss the various types of products and dissemination avenues BJS has developed to demonstrate the value and uses of NIBRS, and the forecast for these products in 2021. This will include updates for participants about technical assistance products, the Joint Statistical Analysis Program, print and online reports, and the NCS-X NIBRS Data Dashboard development.
